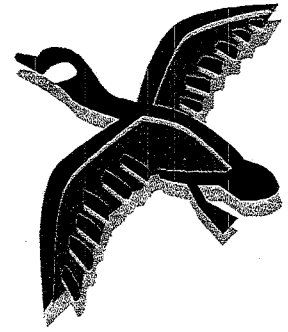

“Identifying Hawks In The Sky”

Presented by Vic Berardi

River Bend Nature Center, 3600 N Green Bay Rd, Racine

Vic Berardi will be discussing the identification of hawks in flight during migration. Some of the finer points of distant hawk ID will be covered. The talk will include a slide presentation and helpful handouts.

Vic has helped with the Concordia Hawkwatch (north of Milwaukee) and at a few other hawkwatches around the Great Lakes. For the last 3 years he has been conducting the hawk migration monitoring effort at Illinois Beach State Park which is a fully recognized hawkwatch of the Hawk Migration Association of North America (HMANA).

He also gives numerous talks and workshops in northern Illinois focusing on hawk identification in flight.

It is mostly wooded with tall 6" - 1 ft diameter trees, fairly thick growth. It is just north of the Smeds Tennis Center parking lot.
