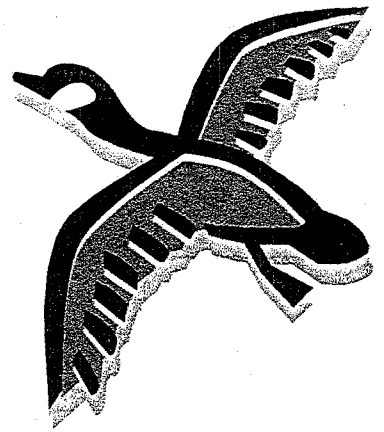

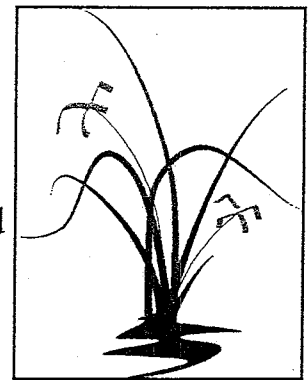

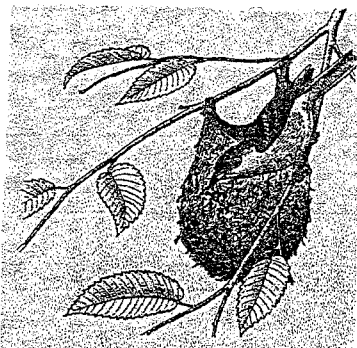

“One Bird-Two Habitats” Presented by Bill Volkert

Why has the number of United States songbirds been decreasing? How do we get their populations to go back up again? These birds only live four months of the year in the U. S. and eight months in the tropics.

Bill Volkert will share with us his first hand experiences of meeting with and educating the people of Nicaragua to find ways to preserve its bird habitats and develop a sustainable land ethic for their beautiful country.



Mr. Volkert is an educator and naturalist at Horicon Marsh National Wildlife Refuge and has been a popular speaker around the state.

Buzzards	A wake
Bobolinks	A chain
Chicks	A brood; clutch
Coots	A cover
Cormorants	A gulp
Cranes	A sedge

Crows	A murder, horde
Dotterel	A trip
Doves	A dule, pitying (specific to turtle doves)
Ducks	A brace, flock (in flight), raft (on water) team, paddling (on water), badling
Eagles	A convocation
Finches	A charm
Flamingos	A stand
