Christopher Lepczyk is a post-doctoral fellow at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in the Department of Forest Ecology and Management where he works on understanding how people interact and influence wildlife. His work has ranged from studying bird behavior to how people interact with wildlife on their property and across landscapes. Currently, Chris is beginning work on how avian communities change in response to housing growth in the Northeast United States using the North American Breeding Bird Survey. For his upcoming talk Chris will discuss how breeding birds respond to human influence across the Midwest as share some of his recent finding from the Northeast.
