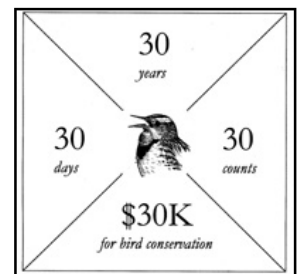

Noel Cutright, past president of the Wisconsin Society for Ornithology, recently celebrated more than 30 years of collecting Breeding Bird Survey data with an unprecedented venture. He traveled the Midwest to conduct one survey each day of June, 2004 -- 30 routes in 30 days, with the goal of raising \$30,000 for bird conservation. He succeeded and to date has raised over \$46,000 (and counting) for the Important Bird Areas program.

Many of the birds that we see in spring, summer and fall spend their winters in the tropics. Maintaining proper habitat in their wintering and breeding grounds and along the migration routes is a continual struggle. Mr. Volkert has been to many of these areas and has a wealth of knowledge about this subject. He will also discuss the ways in which Horicon Marsh fits into this.

Mr. Volkert is an educator and naturalist at Horicon Marsh National Wildlife Refuge, where he has been since 1984, and has been a popular speaker around the state.

**Trip to Crex Meadows to see Sharp-tailed Grouse on April 16 and 17**

Flamingos	A stand
Geese	A flock, gaggle (on the ground), skein (in flight)
Grouse	A pack (in late season)
Gulls	A colony
Hawks	A cast, kettle (flying in large numbers), boil (two or more spiraling in flight)

Hérons	A sedge, a siege
Jays	A party, scold
Lapwings	A deceit
Larks	An exaltation
Mallards	A sord (in flight), brace
Magpies	A tiding, gulp, murder, charm
Nightingales	A watch
Owls	A parliament
Parrots	A company
