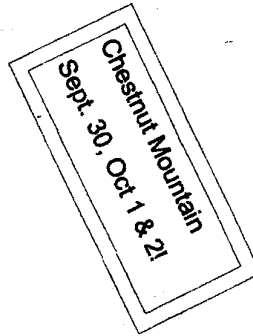

"Status and Trends of Grassland Birds in the Upper Midwest"

Grassland birds in the Upper Midwest have experienced widespread declines over the last three decades and many are among the region's fastest declining species. This talk will discuss the current status of the birds, the factors influencing population declines, and conservation needs in respect to grassland restoration and management efforts.
