



Spring is here!

For our spring field trips, bring your binoculars and your bird book, wear your hiking boots, and bundle up! Spring mornings and evenings can be cool, so wear a warm jacket and gloves. If it's raining lightly, we'll still go on a hike. If it's a downpour, we won't. Birdwatchers at all levels, from beginner to advanced, are welcome! Hoy Field Trip: Evening Woodcock Walk at the Pike River Pathway (Mt. Pleasant, Racine County) Wednesday, April 10

Listen to the peents and see the aerial dances of the twittering "Timberdoodle" at twilight.

From Airline Road and Old Spring Street, go east 0.2 mile and turn right (south) onto Timber Lane. Continue 0.25 mile and turn west onto Wendi Court. Proceed to the end to the parking lot. Meet by 5:30 p.m. and we'll walk the paved loop trail (approximately 1.6 miles) in search of early spring migrants. Or, meet by 7:30 p.m. at the parking area. The American Woodcock may begin to call around 7:45 p.m. We'll conclude around 8:30 p.m. A flashlight is recommended.

Hoy Field Trip: Evening Woodcock Walk at Cliffside Park (Caledonia, Racine County) Wednesday, April 17

Meet by 5:30 p.m. at Picnic Area #2 (near the yellow gate). During the daylight, we'll bird along the main trail north of the yellow gate for spring migrants and may go as far north as the bluff overlooking Lake Michigan to view waterfowl. Or, meet by 7:30 p.m. at the yellow gate. We'll walk the trail northward and await the display of the American Woodcock. The American Woodcock may begin to call around 7:45 p.m. and will conclude around 8:30 p.m. A flashlight is recommended. Some of the trails may be wet (flooded in spots) from recent rainfall; waterproof footwear is advised.

Hoy Field Trip: Evening Woodcock Walks at Chiwaukee Prairie (southeast Kenosha County) Sunday, April 28 & Sunday, May 5

RSVP with Stan Rosenstiel in advance to sign up ((262)694-2206). Walks begin at approximately 6:30 p.m. A flashlight is recommended.

Hoy Field Trip: Evening Warbler Walks at Colonial Park (Racine) Wednesdays, April 24, May 1, 8, 15, 22, 29

Colonial Park is one of the best places in the area to see migratory birds like Warblers, Indigo Buntings, Rose-breasted Grosbeaks, Baltimore Orioles, and Scarlet Tanagers. Our Wednesday evening hikes begin at 5:30 and are a great way to experience the progression of spring migrants that will pass through on their way from southern wintering grounds to their northern breeding grounds, and those birds that summer here.

Picnicking with the Peregrines

Back by popular demand. Bring lunch and enjoy watching the young, newly-fledged [Peregrine Falcons](#) and their parents. The Racine County Courthouse, at 730 Wisconsin Avenue, hosts the most visible Peregrine Falcons in the state! Hoy will have spotting scopes set up near the picnic table on the southwest lawn. Binoculars - bring 'em if you've got 'em!

These falcons are formidable hunters that prey on other birds (and bats) in mid-flight. Peregrines hunt from above and, after sighting their prey, drop into a steep, swift dive that can top 200 miles an hour.

Peregrine Falcons are among the world's most common birds of prey and live on all continents except Antarctica. They prefer wide-open spaces, and thrive near coasts where shorebirds are common, but they can be found everywhere from tundra to deserts.

Peregrine Falcons have nested successfully on the Racine Courthouse and Pleasant Prairie Power Plant for many years. You may view the Peregrine families in person or keep tabs on their progress at falconcam.goracine.org or we-energies.com/environmental/protect_wildlife.htm. The eggs normally hatch about May 5th.

International Migratory Bird Day May 11, 2013

[Hoy Audubon](#) of Kenosha and Racine Counties will have two bird festivals on Saturday, May 11 as part of [International Migratory Bird Day 2013](#). One event will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Kenosha Public Museum, 5500 First Ave., Kenosha, and the other will be from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the [River Bend Nature Center](#), 3600 N. Green Bay Road, Racine. Both gatherings are free and open to the public.

Live birds will be featured at both sites.

The museum will have falconer Ed Foster, treasurer for the [Wisconsin Falconers Association](#), make a presentation on the Mezzanine at 11 a.m. Afterward, the Northern Illinois Raptor Rehab & Education, from Love's Park, Illinois will show off various raptors between noon and 2 p.m.

In Racine, the [Schlitz Audubon Nature Center](#), from Milwaukee, will present its raptors at 2 p.m.

There are various other programs planned. Kenosha will have a bird display, design your own bird activity, and other attractions. A Bluebird talk is set for 10:30 a.m. to 11 a.m.

Racine will have a beginning birding class from 10:30 a.m. to noon. Birding walks will take place if the weather cooperates.

Report Your Chimney Swift Sightings!

Once again this year the Driftwood Wildlife Association will be plotting the swifts' movements northward over the next few months. Colonial Park

This is the favorite park of locals and visiting birders. Located at the end of West High Street which is accessible off Hwy. 38 about 2.1 miles east of its intersection with Hwy. 31. The numbers of birds seen in spring migration can range to spectacular. The Root

River bisects the park and the trails which hug the river are usually the most productive. Thirty-seven species of warblers have been recorded in the park over the years including Kirtland's, Prairie, Hooded, Kentucky, Worm-eating, Yellow-throated, and Yellow-breasted Chat. Other rarities include Carolina Wren, Northern Mockingbird, White-eyed Vireo, and Summer Tanager.

Hoy Audubon Society hosts a number of bird walks here every spring which are always a lot of fun. Check the activity calendar for the dates for this year's hikes and come join us!

Global Great Backyard Bird Count Shatters Records!

New York, NY - From Antarctica to Afghanistan, bird watchers from 103 countries made history in the first global [Great Backyard Bird Count \(GBBC\)](#), February 15–18, 2013.

In the largest worldwide bird count ever, bird watchers set new records, counting more than 25.5 million birds on 120,000+ checklists in four days—and recording 3,144 species, nearly one-third of the world's total bird species. The data will continue to flow in until March 1.

Building on the success of the GBBC in the United States and Canada for the past 15 years, Audubon, the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, and Bird

Studies Canada opened the count to the rest of the world for the first time this year, powered by [eBird](#), a system that enables people to report birds globally in real-time and explore the results online. Bird watchers are invited to keep counting every day of the year at www.eBird.org.
